Thank you for your past support of SPAWNERS! With your help, our group has continued to expand efforts to preserve, protect, and restore San Pablo Creek and its tributaries. We'd like to thank you for your role in our work, and share some of our 2019 accomplishments:

- Over 700 volunteer hours clearing over 200 cubic feet of invasive species and 50 bags of trash
- 37 public events including volunteer work parties, nature walks, and talks
- 12 water quality monitoring events at 4 sites in the San Pablo Creek Watershed
- 4 watershed newsletters on topics such as hummingbird habitat and the history of our Wilkie Creek Park
- 3 talks on Native American plants, native ferns, and a special showing of In the Land of My Ancestors
- 2 trash assessments on San Pablo Creek
- 3 service learning events with students from local schools
